

ROI AND RAISSA




Roi is a seventh grader who dreams of being a pilot someday. His sweet smile and bright personality hide some of the pain he has experienced throughout his life. Roi is smart, and he has a bright future ahead through sponsorship and access to HELPS programs!

Roi was born in Manila but moved to Dumaguete later when his grandmother, Leonora, took in Roi and his other three siblings. Their parents split leaving the kids behind, and to this day his parents have their own families and do not support Roi or his siblings. Leonora works hard for less than \$3 per day and also is the primary caregiver for her own mother who is elderly and bedridden. She always did her best to provide for Roi and the others so they could go to school and have a better life, but it was very hard.



Roi and his siblings walk very far to school each day, rain or shine. They do it happily because they understand the importance of education in their futures. They live in a very small home with a traditional nipa roof made of leaves, and they all share a sleeping area. The rainy season is tough because sometimes the roof leaks and it becomes cold, but they are grateful because at least they have a place to stay.

Roi met a classmate who was sponsored at LCP and immediately encouraged his grandma to find out how to apply. At first, she was overwhelmed because she did not know how, but finally she made a friend in the community who was able to tell her where to go and who to talk to. Leonora applied for Roi to be sponsored, then they waited for God to provide a sponsor.



In September 2023, Roi's life was changed by his new sponsor, Raissa! Raissa was moved by Roi's case study and their similarities. She is also originally from Manila, and their birthdays are only a few days apart. Once Raissa started sponsoring, she loved receiving letters from Roi and being able to send him gifts. She feels overwhelmingly grateful to be able to share the blessings God has given her with a special kid like Roi.

After less than a year of sponsorship, Roi's life is completely different. He feels excited for the future and hopeful that his dreams may one day come true through God's help. RONILO GIVES BACK TO LCP PRESCHOOLS



Ronilo's journey with LCP started when he was in Preschool at just 4 years old. Our preschools teach the basics of reading, writing, English, and math as well as biblical principles. He continued attending LCP after preschool and was sponsored all throughout his education. After graduating from high school, he was granted a college scholarship to pursue university. In 2022, Ronilo graduated with his bachelor's degree in Hospitality Management from NORSU and fully completed the LCP program as an outstanding scholar. After graduation, he began working at a local hotel. While he enjoyed his work, he felt the Lord calling him back to LCP to give back and pay it forward to the organization that changed his life.

In 2023, Ronilo was hired as the Preschool, School on Wheels, and Library Coordinator. Now, he spends his days enriching the lives of the over 100 preschoolers in the same situation he was in just a few years ago to grant them a strong educational foundation through a Christian lens. He has assisted in reinstating the School on Wheels Program for out-of-school youth currently serving 12 students that was paused during the pandemic, and he has also helped revamp the library and computer lab to promote early literacy and access to the internet for assignments. We are so proud of Ronilo for being a sponsorship success, and for how he is playing a part in changing lives of children like he once was. This transition will occur over the next two years with the school year starting progressively earlier to allow for minimal lost educational time or an excessively long break.



EASTER 2024: PEACE AND FAITH IN JESUS



Easter at LCP brings everyone together to celebrate the risen savior! This year, over 3000 people spilled out of the open-air chapel for a 5am sunrise service coming from near and far for worship. This is a beautiful picture of the body of Christ and the Peace and Faith Program in action.

The Peace and Faith Program is committed to sharing the gospel of Christ to children and their families. So many lives have been changed eternally through salvation and spiritual enrichment. With rising transportation costs, we have increased our budgets to

provide funds to reduce the amount needed for sponsored children and their parents to come to church and Bible studies each week. We also provide Bibles in the local language and in English. Poverty should not prevent a child or their family from being able to engage with other believers in communal worship or with the Word in a language that they understand.

In addition, the Peace and Faith Program regularly does outreach to the community through evangelism, advocacy, and encouragement. Every program from feeding malnourished children, to educational initiatives, treatment in the health clinic, and more are done through a Christian lens and informed by the ideals of the Peace and Faith Program. It is our largest and most foundational program.

SHELTER FOR ELNA MAE



Elna Mae is 22 years old and is currently finishing up her second year in college at Negros Oriental State University studying IT and computer technology. She was admitted to the LCP Residential Shelter in June of 2010 and has grown up with us since then. She was referred to the shelter by the LCP School on Wheels Program since she was not in school. She was 9 years old at that time but had never started school. Elna's mother died due to illness when she was 2 years old, and just one week later, her father left her. Her very elderly grandmother tried to care for her, but they were living in a dilapidated, small shack in the squatter area. Life was so hard.

Once she came to the shelter she had a safe place to stay where all her needs were met. Shortly after, she became sponsored through the LCP sponsorship program. She said, living in the shelter is an opportunity for her to have a bright future. She is very responsible in

many ways and values her opportunity for education and a better life. She is trustworthy and has shown good leadership skills. She works hard on her education, is very smart, and gets good grades. Her life would never be the same again and since she received a helping hand, she is now equipped to be able to help others in the future.

Currently, we have 73 children residing in the 5 shelters at LCP. So many have stories like Elna where they have nowhere to go and have no hope, but with opportunity and assistance, these children can thrive!
