



A Helping Hand Success: Aphrodite

Aphrodite was born to a very poor family of farmers in the far reaching parts of the mountains well outside the city. Their small home made of dilapidated light materials like bamboo and traditional nipa could only be reached after climbing a steep incline and was close to a rugged cliff. She had many odds stacked against her, but she did not give up.

Aphrodite's parents wanted her to have an opportunity for a better life. Despite their remote living situation, they became a part of LCP's Timbao community and applied for sponsorship. This felt like the opportunity of a lifetime. She and her family faithfully participated, attended Sunday worship, and prayed God would send them a sponsor. After waiting for a little while, she became eligible for sponsorship and was sponsored! Aphrodite was just a little girl when she was first sponsored in November 2009.

Sponsorship did not take away all their struggles. She and her mom would make the long journey into the city together to be able to attend activities at LCP, and she and her siblings walked to school at 6:30am each day. Her family lost their home due to Typhoon Odette. She had to have an operation while she was in college and attended classes while she was recovering so she would not get behind. And, during COVID when all classes were virtual, she had to climb a tree to get enough signal to do her classes. She never



LCP and her sponsors supported her through it all. Today, Aphrodite is 22 years old and a college graduate. She received her bachelor's degree in secondary education with a focus on English this year. Her dream of becoming a teacher is a reality. She has a college degree, confidence in herself and her accomplishments, and hope for the future.

None of this would be possible without sponsorship and scholarship. So many graduates like Aphrodite have lives that are dramatically different because someone like you gave a hand up to a better future. Making the Most of Your Contribution



You may have noticed we are being more intentional about requesting credit card fees on credit card contributions. This may look like a preselected checkbox on an online form or a verbal request from one of our staff over the phone. This is a strategic initiative to cover overhead expenses so we can be sure the maximum amount of each contribution can be used to change lives. We are eternally grateful for every contribution! In 2024, we had to fundraise over \$20,000 in credit card fees alone. We process hundreds of credit card transactions each week each one with a ~2.5% transaction fee, so the fees add up.

This is why we have begun inviting you to help carry the load! What ends up being a few extra cents on your transaction multiplied by 1000s of donors and transactions, really adds us. This is 100% optional, but it is a huge help to us and supports our mission in a huge way! We are always grateful for your contribution, but we want to be transparent about the reasoning why we are offering the opportunity to cover the fee. Please know that we want to be able to make the most out of your contribution and not have to raise funds to cover the credit card fees. A Hand Up to a Better Future: Grades, SWAP, and Participation

We aways say sponsorship and college scholarship are a "Hand Up" to a better and brighter future or a "Helping Hand." These are not just taglines or slogans, but they are important tenants of our mission and all the work we do. Giving a Hand Up to a better future means we are empowering people to be able to make a difference in their own life through financial partnership and access to education.

Financial partnership does not exist to create dependence or be a handout, but instead, it allows beneficiaries to be involved in the process through service and community building. This builds confidence, creates opportunities for skill building, and generates buy -in from beneficiaries to know they are empowered to make changes in their lives. LCW support is a Hand Up because we take the partnership aspect incredibly seriously.

Access to education is critical because once a student finishes high school or their college degree, they are much more equipped to earn a better income to support themselves and their families in the future. Education is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty. Once an individual becomes educated, they are more likely to encourage education for the younger generations.



Sponsorship and college scholarship involve participation from the donor and the beneficiary. Sponsors agree to provide financial support, and beneficiaries agree to give back through Service With A Purpose, community participation, and maintaining good grades. These commitments are critical for our program to be effective and to create lasting change. We take them so seriously, in fact, that failure to comply results in dismissal from the program.

Service With A Purpose (SWAP) is a 15 hour community service requirement that each sponsored family commits to when they are accepted for sponsorship. This gives beneficiaries an opportunity to serve their community, learn new skills, and feel involved in full benefits of sponsorship. Service can be given in a variety of contexts like cleaning common areas, tutoring a neighbor, or whatever way they want to serve. Community participation is accomplished through activities like attending community meetings, Sunday worship and Sunday school, Bible studies, and other activities that contribute to our mission of building caring communities. Maintaining good grades is required because we want students to do well so they will be able to graduate one day.

We want to empower as many children and families as possible, but we do everything we can to hold all parties accountable for their participation in sponsorship and college scholarship. It is our blessing to give these families an opportunity to breakaway from the struggles of poverty and the challenges that come with it. Thank you for being Sponsors and College Donors and for giving a Hand Up to a better future to someone in need. You can know your sponsored family is invested and is also doing their part!
