

# General Information

#### **The Philippines**

- If it is day in the US, it is night in the Philippines.
- Dumaguete City is located on the boot shaped island of Negros in the central-southern part of the Philippines.

#### Language

- Tagalog is the national language of the Philippines, however Cebuano is the regional dialect that is spoken in Dumaguete.
- English is taught in schools, but is usually only spoken by college educated individuals.

#### Circumstances

 There are 1.5 million street children in the Philippines alone and many actually sleep in the street. They work as street vendors, selling peanuts, etc. Some dive into water to collect coins, shells, or oysters for pearls. Many clean motorcycles or pedicabs.

#### Sleeping

• LCP children sleep on mats in homes with dirt or bamboo floors.

#### Money

- Pesos—Approximately 50 pesos to a US \$1.00. (changes frequently)
- Average daily pay for a working parent is \$1.40 for long hours.

#### Church

- Worship is held in the LCP open air chapel each Sunday.
- Sunday school classes are held under the mango trees.

#### **Bible**

• Each person studies the Gospel of John and answers questions in the discovery material to receive a free Bible.

#### Homes

- Most families live in a one-room house or house with a loft.
- In Dumaguete, most houses are Nipa huts—bamboo with thatched roofs (woven leaves together)
- Houses are often built high above the ground to protect their homes during the rainy season. They also cook under the houses, as well as raise pigs or chickens under the house.
- Many homes do not have bathrooms (CR-comfort room). The CR has only a commode surrounded by fabric or concrete blocks over a hole.
- Electricity is very limited with a light bulb in the ceiling and only one plug, if the family has electricity at all.
- Homes often do not have running water, so they use a community well.

# Additional Ways to Help

# **Higher Education:**

We send every eligible sponsored child to college. A high school average of 84% or higher is required for College Work Scholarship Program at LCP. Sponsorship continues through college. However, college requires additional expenses in addition to sponsorship. A college degree opens up tremendous opportunities for jobs. In the Philippines, many jobs including bel-hops, fast food cooks, gas station attendants, etc. are unavailable without a degree. If you are able, you are welcome to support your sponsored child's college education in addition to sponsorship. If you are not able to support college in addition to sponsorship - That's OK! We will match your sponsored child with a donor for a scholarship. As a sponsor, you are not obligated to pay your child's college tuition.

# **Cost of Higher Education:**

The annual cost for one student is \$400 per semester.

As of the 2023-2024 school year, all LCW college scholarships are \$400 per semester (2 semesters per year) per student for all courses and schools. Students may be enrolled in a 2 or 4 year course at a variety of Universities. This program is for students accepted into the scholarship program. Additional information about the College Work Scholarship Program is available in the College Manual.

Sponsorship continues throughout college at \$35 per month.

LCW is proud to have over 350 total college graduates scattered throughout the Philippines as well as other countries.

# Additional Ways to Help

### **Health Insurance:**

In addition to sponsorship, Hospitalization Insurance is available for **\$142 per year**. This covers hospitalization costs for children and immediate family living in the same home in the event of a medical emergency. Even public hospitals will not take patients without insurance or means of payment.

### **Programs:**

The holistic HELPS strategy covers both physical and spiritual needs. Partner financially with any of our programs to make a difference that directly benefits your sponsored child. We fundraise for each program individually, so donations to any program or our Urgent Needs Fund directly helps your child.

### **Pray:**

Every penny counts, but your prayers are more valuable than gold. We pray for the Lord's blessing on this ministry and we give thanks for our sponsors and donors every day. Pray for your child and their family to give honor to the Lord in everything they do.

### **Volunteer:**

You can travel to the Philippines to meet your sponsored child and volunteer in any of our programs, or you can help out in our office in the US.

### **Encourage:**

Encourage your child to do well in school and fulfill their commitments at LCP, but also encourage them to grow in their relationship with the Lord. Sponsored children often look up to their sponsors as parent-like figures, so your encouragement goes a long way.

# Can I sponsor more than one child? Yes!

Can I pick the gender and age?

Yes, you can choose a boy or girl and also choose an age preference. From the priority list, one will be selected as closely to your request as possible.

# Can the same Filipino family have more than one sponsored child?

No. There are hundreds of other children on the waiting list. Some have been waiting for a long time. Only under extreme circumstances is this permitted.

#### How long does sponsorship continue?

It is entirely up to you. As a general rule, we encourage sponsors to see the child through high school if possible. However, most sponsors cultivate a special bond with their child that carries them through college.

### What are other ways I can help my sponsored child/family?

Encourage your child and family to abide by the LCP rules of sponsorship (SWAP 10 hours of service with a purpose), participate in Sunday School, Worship, Community Bible Study, and Federation meetings. Encourage your child to attend school regularly, study hard and do homework to prevent failing grades. Failure to keep their commitment to LCP could result in loss of sponsorship. Encourage your friends, family and church to sponsor children on the priority waiting list. There are currently over 300 children waiting to be sponsored.

# How do we determine clothing and shoes sizes for our sponsored child?

From information on the questionnaire mailed from LCP at the end of each year or call the LCW office for assistance.

## **Late Sponsorship Payments:**

- After 1 month sponsors will receive a reminder letter.
- Contingency money is used to cover sponsorship until payment is received.
- Area Representatives will call the sponsor if payment is not received by the 3rd month.
- Contingency money is very limited. If a response has not been received by the 4th month, LCW will be forced to drop the sponsorship.

If you have unexpected financial difficulties, please call the LCW office and we will attempt to work with you. If you can no longer support a child, the sponsorship staff needs to know as quickly as possible. Please help us find a replacement such as a friend, relative, Sunday school class, or civic group.

### **Termination of Sponsorship:**

LCW is a hand up not a hand out. Failure of sponsored children to keep commitment to the policies of LCW/LCP will forfeit sponsorship. Examples are failing to do Service With A Purpose (10 hours service to an LCP program of choice each month), dropping out of school, family moves out of LCP area, failing grades, pregnancy/getting someone pregnant, use of illegal drugs, graduation from High School if not pursuing college, and graduation from college. Another reason would be a Sponsor's non-payment of sponsorship for 4 months.

# Sponsorship Information

### **Gifts:**

Special gifts for occasions like Christmas, their birthday, and school starting are a treat to sponsored children. Many sponsors choose to send items or give money for those events. However, there is no obligation to give anything in addition to your sponsorship payment. Again, gifts help create a special bond between sponsor and child, and they also help meet additional needs that cannot be covered with sponsorship.

If you would like for LCW to include your gift in one of our shipments to LCP, please send it to the LCW Office address in clear ziplock bags with the child's name on the outside of the bag. Please include a list of items in the gift and the cost for your in-kind receipt. Please also include a donation for the shipping fee with your gift. LCW ships the first of March, July, August, and December. These shipments take 2-3 months to reach LCP so send your gift in the shipment that will ensure its arrival at the desired date.

#### **Gift Suggestions:**

Books, clothing, backpacks, school supplies, Bibles, stuffed animals, toys, hygiene items, canned meat, etc.

Food Packages are available as gifts for \$10, \$15, and \$20.

Money is always appreciated since the families can purchase most of their needed items in Dumaguete. Money for gifts can be sent to the LCW Office and it will be wired to the Philippines in the next monthly transfer of funds.

**DO NOT SEND CASH OR CHECKS TO THE PHILIPPINES** (Cash may be stolen and checks cannot be cashed in the Philippines).

If you send packages directly, the child/parent may be charged a customs fee to receive the package. Often the customs fees are expensive and the child's family may not be able to pay this amount and will not be able to receive the package. **Do not send packages directly to LCP.** 

## **Cost of Sponsorship:**



Full Sponsorship: \$35 per month (\$420 per year)
Half Sponsorship: \$17.50 per month (\$210 per year)
(Matched by another half sponsor)

### **What Does Sponsorship Cover?**

**Sponsorship** covers the basic needs of the child, including preventive health care, education, and Christian nurturing. The family of the sponsored child enjoys the privileges of membership in LCP, which includes opportunities for livelihood, leadership training in the LCP community, tutorial opportunities as needed for their children, used clothing, family assistance for medicines and medical care, Bible studies and Christian fellowship in a close-knit and caring community. Sponsored children or their parents also give back 10 hours of **Service With A Purpose** every month to develop leadership skills and responsibility.

# **How Your Money Helps:**

#### **International Support:**

70% is deposited directly into a bank account under the child's name.

15% is used for child services such as social workers, youth assistants, sponsorship correspondence, home and school visits, pictures, reports, updates to sponsors, and local administration of these services.

#### **Administration:**

15% is used for sponsorship services in the USA such as sponsorship office, fund raising through the *Jericho Street Echoes* quarterly newsletters, and the yearly *Hand in Hand* newsletters. **These funds directly benefit the sponsored children because with these funds, we are able to raise funds for the LCP programs, all of which help the sponsored children.** Without these funds, LCW would be unable to provide sponsorship services for these precious children.

Children actually receive far more given to them by indirect social services than the 15% withheld. So, between the direct and indirect services, the children receive far more than 100% of the sponsorship monthly payments. See page six.

We do everything we can to keep the funds directly benefiting the sponsored children. In many cases through the years, the USA 15% funds have also supplemented LCP Programs.



### **Progress Reports:**

You will receive an annual report on the status of your child, and you will also receive quarterly personal letters from your child. In your reply, you may ask the child anything you would like to know. Due to request from many sponsors, you will receive a questionnaire with sample questions the Sponsorship staff has developed for the children to answer. It is for informational purposes only. **No one is under any obligation to fulfill any of the needs that may be revealed.** 

You will also receive pictures of your child with any gifts you send or send money for them to buy.

### **Communication:**

Sponsored children love to receive letters and pictures from their sponsors and donors. That way you can really get to know each other, and understand how much positive change you have brought to your child's life. You can write your child at:

Letters and emails are monitored for protection of both sponsor and child. Becoming friends on social media is **PROHIBITED**.

### **Policy on Direct Communications**

Direct, unmonitored communications between sponsors and sponsored children are not permitted. For purposes of this policy, sponsored children are defined as youth under the age of 18. Failure to adhere to this prohibition may result in loss of sponsorship status for the child or inability of the sponsor to serve in that capacity.
