

## **Graduation Time**

We believe in breaking the cycle of poverty one educational milestone at a time! In June and July, we celebrated our graduates at all levels for accomplishing greatness and completing another level of education.

LCP is proud to offer Preschool at seven different centers strategically located to give underprivileged children access to early education. We celebrated 116 Preschool graduates who are now well prepared for elementary school and gave them an excellent head start as they proceed with their education.

Graduating Senior High School is an especially impressive and sought after accomplishment that many students do not get the chance to do. Students in our Sponsorship Program are supported to attend public High Schools. This year, 54 Senior High graduates walked across the stage to receive their diplomas. Of those 54 graduates, an impressive 50 will proceed to College through an LCP Scholarship!

Completing a College education is the epitome of success for our program. A degree can break the cycle of generational poverty and set one up for a

lifetime of opportunity. We are incredibly proud of our 2023 College graduates. 23 students graduated from College with various degrees in 2 and 4 year courses. They have grown up at LCP from as young as preschool or kindergarten, and we have watched in amazement as they have blossomed into smart, talented, and impressive young adults ready to take on the world. Their degrees ranged from education to criminology and everything in between, but the opportunities they have been provided have changed their lives forever! May they be abundantly blessed as they proceed with their careers and wherever life may take them.

We conduct many activities like Bible studies, Sunday school, weekly worship, VBS, Venture Youth Camp, and more that are the obvious manifestations of the Peace and Faith Program, but every program's activities are informed by our commission. Whether one is receiving medical care, being fed in one of our soup kitchens, or living in one of our shelters for abused or neglected children, everyone feels the love of God, not just

Donabel Salcedo and Lovely Ann Baldivino are just two of LCP's most recent class of graduates, but they're special in that they are the first students to ever finish college who were enrolled in LCP's School on Wheels Program.

School on Wheels is a program designed to target out of school youth who are at risk of falling behind. These children are some of the poorest of the poor, and are often living in much worse conditions than the average sponsored child. The pull of the streets and the grips of abject poverty make these children particularly hard to reach and see through higher education. Pressures to work, lack of familial support, and lack of understanding about the long-term benefits of higher education are all important factors in these students dropping out prior to completion.

## **Health Equals Opportunity**

Born with a congenital heart defect and plagued by severe financial hardships, Maria Rosal wondered if she would ever have a chance in life. She was a bright young woman, full of resilience; all she needed was an opportunity to live. Without surgery, her future would be grim.

Without a father in the picture, she and her mother joined LCP when she was young after exhausting all other options to receive treatment. LCP was an answered prayer. The Health Program identified a sponsor to cover the cost of her operation in Thailand. She made a full recovery and was

granted sponsorship and educational support all the way through high school. She grew into a smart, active young woman, unincumbered by the condition that once could have claimed her life.

After finishing senior high, she qualified for an LCP College Scholarship. She grabbed the opportunity and did not look back. She is a strong woman, determined to overcome the setbacks and challenges she has in her life. She succeeded academically and at LCP, and she joined the choir and dance teams. She became a confident leader with a strong faith in God. Maria Rosal proceeded to college, studying Education. This June, she graduated with her BS in Early Childhood Education. She has a heart for teaching children and looks forward to a future of shaping young lives.
